Clint asked a question about complaints about the science fair. Can we change things to help students actually learning?

Discussion about how the STEM fair is different. Other categories that don't use the scientific method.

Discussion about the major discipline issues/out of school suspension. Seven since last meeting.

Jeff asked a question about suicide: seems high. Unfortunately, we're on par with the state and behind the district numbers wise. We are doing a good job catching ideations.

- Discussion about many good things happening, especially with math. Ernie's opinion is that 4th grade reading is top in the state.
- Master Schedule
 - More growth and flexibility. Colored section will switch. (PE/College Studies etc.)
- STEM Designation update
 - Preliminary recommendation: gold or platinum? Gold right now. Really positive visit from the committee. State Board approval in April.
 - We scored lower than we wanted in a few categories. Working on those. Then we'll be potentially platinum level.
- Dress code survey results
 - 50% said it's not an important factor
 - If we filter out people who say it isn't a factor, the predominate opinion is somewhere between TSD and uniforms.
 - Only 4 said they'd leave if we required uniforms. 10ish said they'd maybe leave.
 - Our own thoughts: We want to find something that reduces distractions. Don't have
 - The committee will propose something similar to keeping it as it is, but more clearly stated.

1. 2019-20 School Calendar

- 1. TSC has fewer days than us. 990 hrs. 173 days minimum. We did 174 days.
 - Half days count as a full day if it's over 4 hrs.
 - Can we do half days on our PDs? We'd have to do two half days to give teachers the 8 hrs they need.
 - District starts one week later than us. 19th.
