

The following guidelines are set in place to ensure the safety of our students and to provide adequate time for students to enjoy recess with their peers.

Morning: Teachers responsible for monitoring students during morning recess.

Lunch: Specialists are responsible for monitoring students during lunch recess.

Afternoon: Teachers are responsible for monitoring students during afternoon recess, if provided.

If the weather is questionable, an administrator will make an announcement by 9:25 a.m.

If it is lightly sprinkling or snowing, students may still go outside. Full rain, snow, hail, or lightning will be cause for inside recess.

Temperature: Recess will be held outside if the temperature is 22 degrees or warmer. This also takes into account the wind chill factor. Official source:

Air Quality: We use and follow the Department of Air Quality (DAQ) guidelines for when to stay in. Students with doctor's notes may stay in on orange days. All students will stay in on red days. Outdoor recess rules: include, but are not limited to: Follow school rules, no climbing on fences, no throwing snowballs, no sliding on ice, no laying on the monkey bars, no tackling-fighting-fake fighting, no dangerous games, slide down slides (do not climb up them) no student loitering in the school halls, or between double doors. If you don't have a coat, you still go out (k-3: borrow from the lost and found. 4-5: go out without a coat and bring one next time). If a ball goes over the fence, please tell an adult and they will take care of it after recess.
