What is Title I?

Title I Part A, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), provides financial assistance to districts and schools with high numbers of students from families who are considered “at-risk” or “disadvantaged”.

- Economically disadvantaged, disabled, migrants, or those who have limited English proficiency.

The goal behind Title I is to “ensure all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach at least proficiency in state academic standards and assessments”.

Title I Fund Approaches

Title I provides funds to schools and districts to provide additional support and learning opportunities so all students can master the curriculum and meet the states challenging standards.

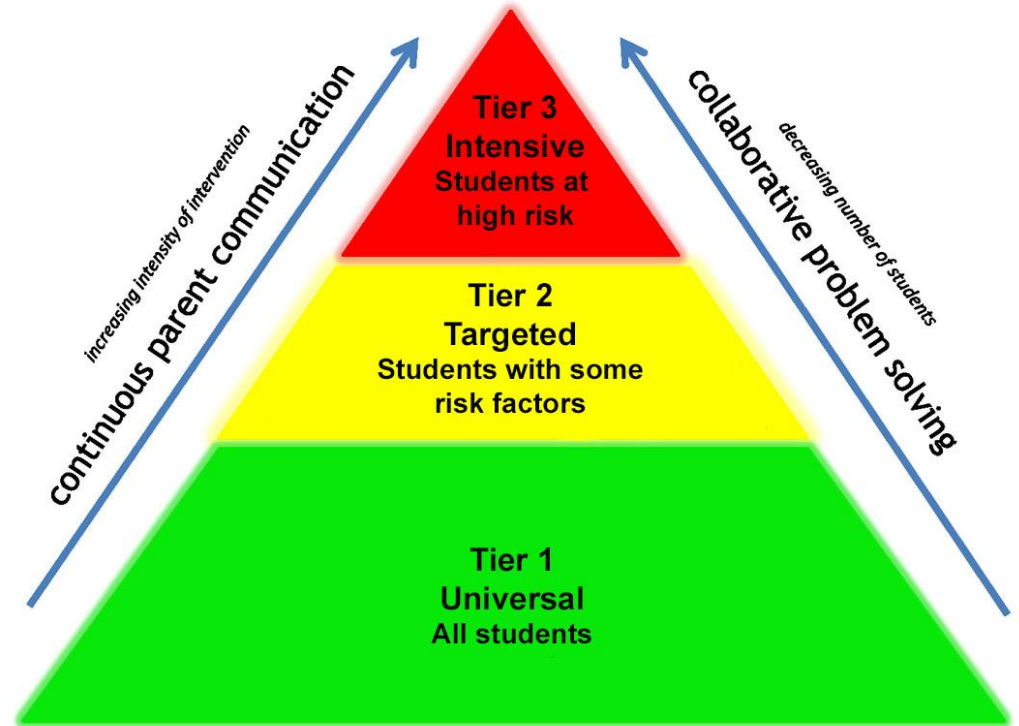
Two Approaches:

1. Targeted Approach: Only the percentage of students who are considered “at-risk” or “disadvantaged” are getting supports with funds.
2. Whole School Approach: Whole school regardless of students who considered “at-risk” or “disadvantaged” are getting supports based on needs.

How does Bonneville Academy use Title I Funds?

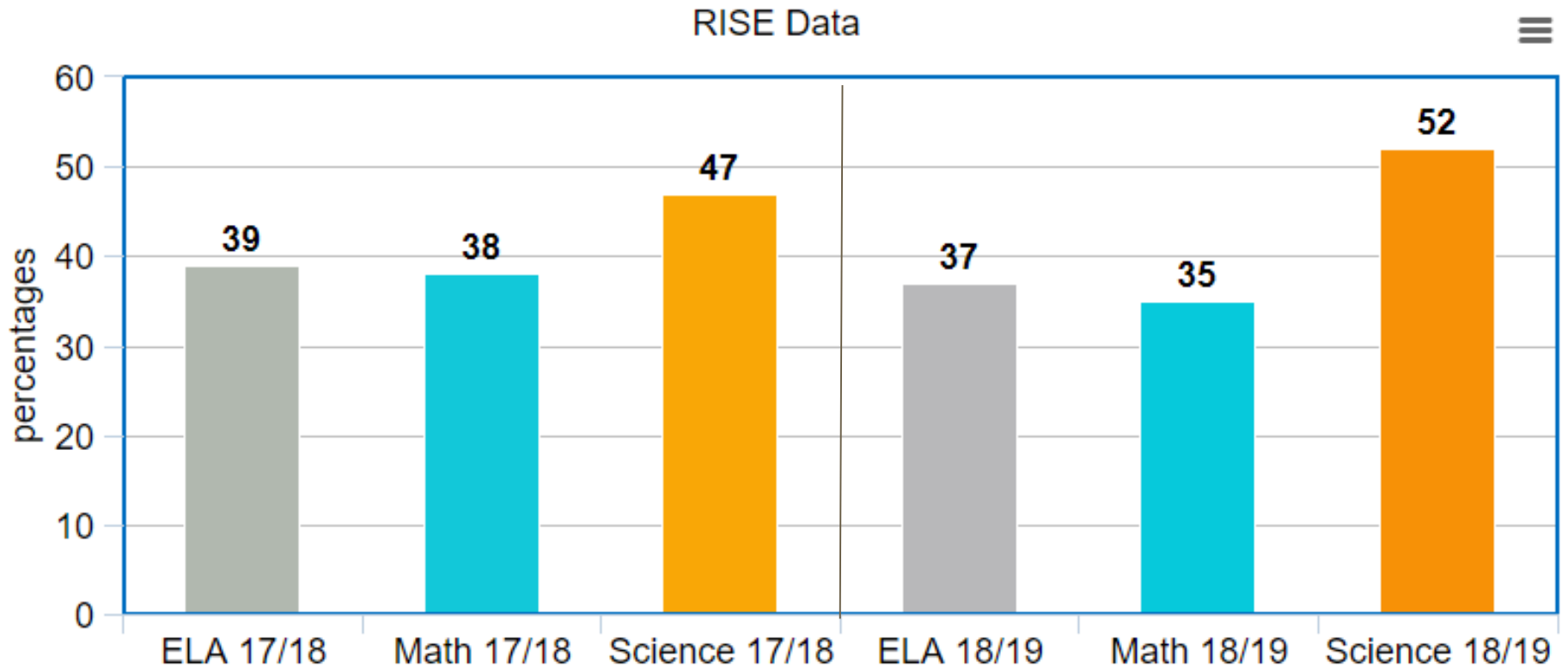
About 30% of students qualify as “at-risk” but there is also a large academic need.

Bonneville Academy has established that we will allocate these funds for tiered support for our students.

2017 and 2018 RISE Data Achievement



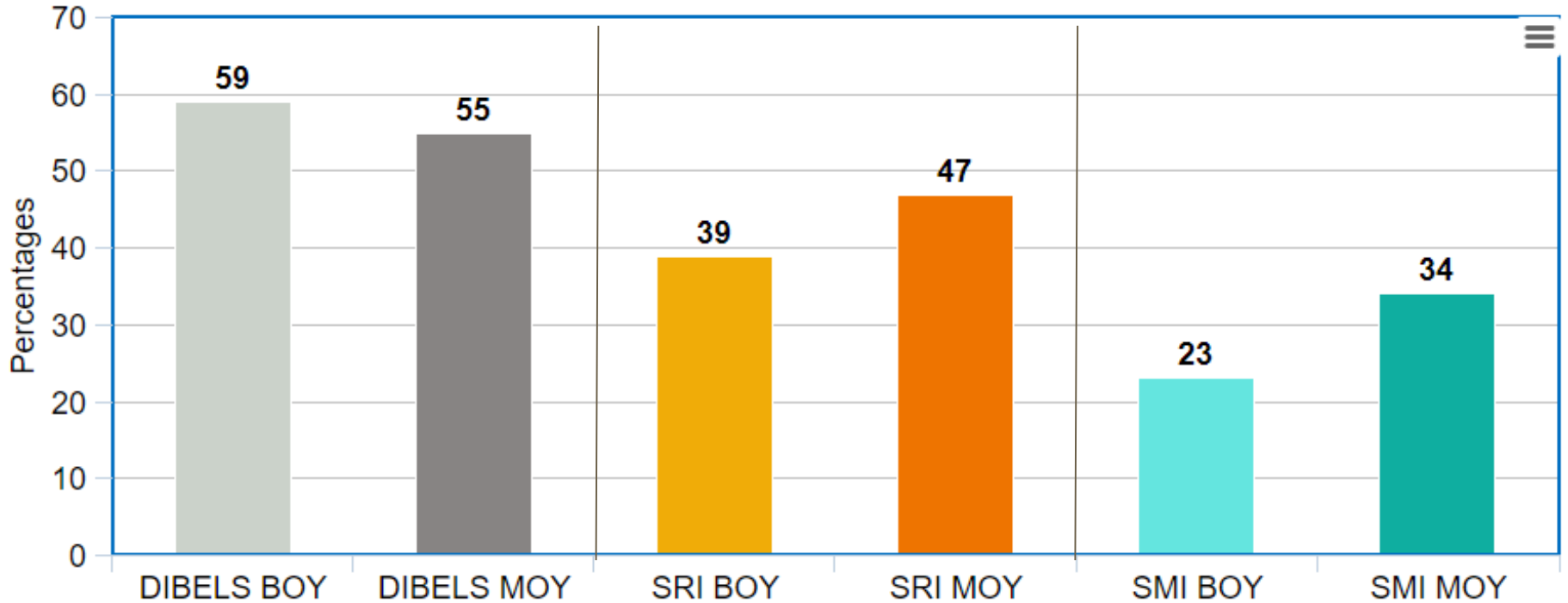
School Goals and Use of Title I Funds
